The Ladies of Charity (LOC) is a non-profit organization affiliated with the Association of International Charities and is an active member of the Archdiocese of Washington Ladies of Charity.

This organization strives for social justice by helping the needy in a spirit of humility, simplicity and charity which follows the works of its founders St. Vincent de Paul and St. Louise de Marillac.

Members attend the Annual National Assembly convention with the Ladies of Charity of the United States of America (L.C.U.S.A.).

The LOC is involved in both direct and indirect services to the needy. Fundraisers are given annually to help fund the services provided to the less fortunate in the parish and surrounding East of the River Anacostia communities.

These services include providing emergency assistance to families in need; food for the homeless and seniors; layettes for teen parents; maintaining a food pantry; visiting the sick (hospitals, nursing homes and/or homebound); sponsoring "Shoes 4 Kids" Fund; mentoring students; partnering with other non-profit organizations through our "Giving Hearts" project; and providing food, clothes and toys to needy families at Christmas.
